Texas Disposal Systems wins Kyle honor

Texas Disposal Systems, a waste services provider in Central Texas, was named the 2022 Large Business of Year by the Kyle Area Chamber of Commerce.

This comes after several years of service to the community, and after committing \$1.5 million to the Heroes Memorial Park initiative.

Texas Disposal Systems provides residential and commercial solid waste collection for Kyle, and several surrounding communities in Central Texas. According to its website, the company is now one of the largest independently-owned resource management companies in the country.

With more than 1,000 employees, TDS has offices in Austin, San Antonio, Georgetown, San Angelo, Alpine, Weimar and Sealy. Its facilities handle solid waste disposal, materials processing, compost produc-

tion, and recycling operations. Between 3,000 and 4,000 tons of solid waste are processed each day, diverting about 441,400 tons of waste per year from landfill disposal, the company says.

Texas Disposal Systems provides waste processing services to the local school district serving Kyle and has led the initiative to develop Heroes Memorial Park, a public space that will honor the community's heroes — its veterans and first responders.

Heroes Memorial Park will be the cornerstone of the city's Brick and Mortar District, a 138-acre, pedestrian-oriented, mixed-use development within the Plum Creek master planned community.

"This memorial would not be possible without the generous support of our partner, Texas Disposal Systems, and the tireless work and commitment of our city council and staff," said Kyle Mayor Travis Mitchell.

The Kyle Area Chamber of Commerce's Excellence in Commerce Awards are designed to recognize individuals, companies and non-profit organizations that have shown their commitment to Kyle's eco-

nomie growth and development through their exceptional business practices and commitment to the community, the news release stated.

Leaders with the company say this recognition shows that their collaborative model for community relationship building is beneficial for the company and the communities it serves, the news release states.
