

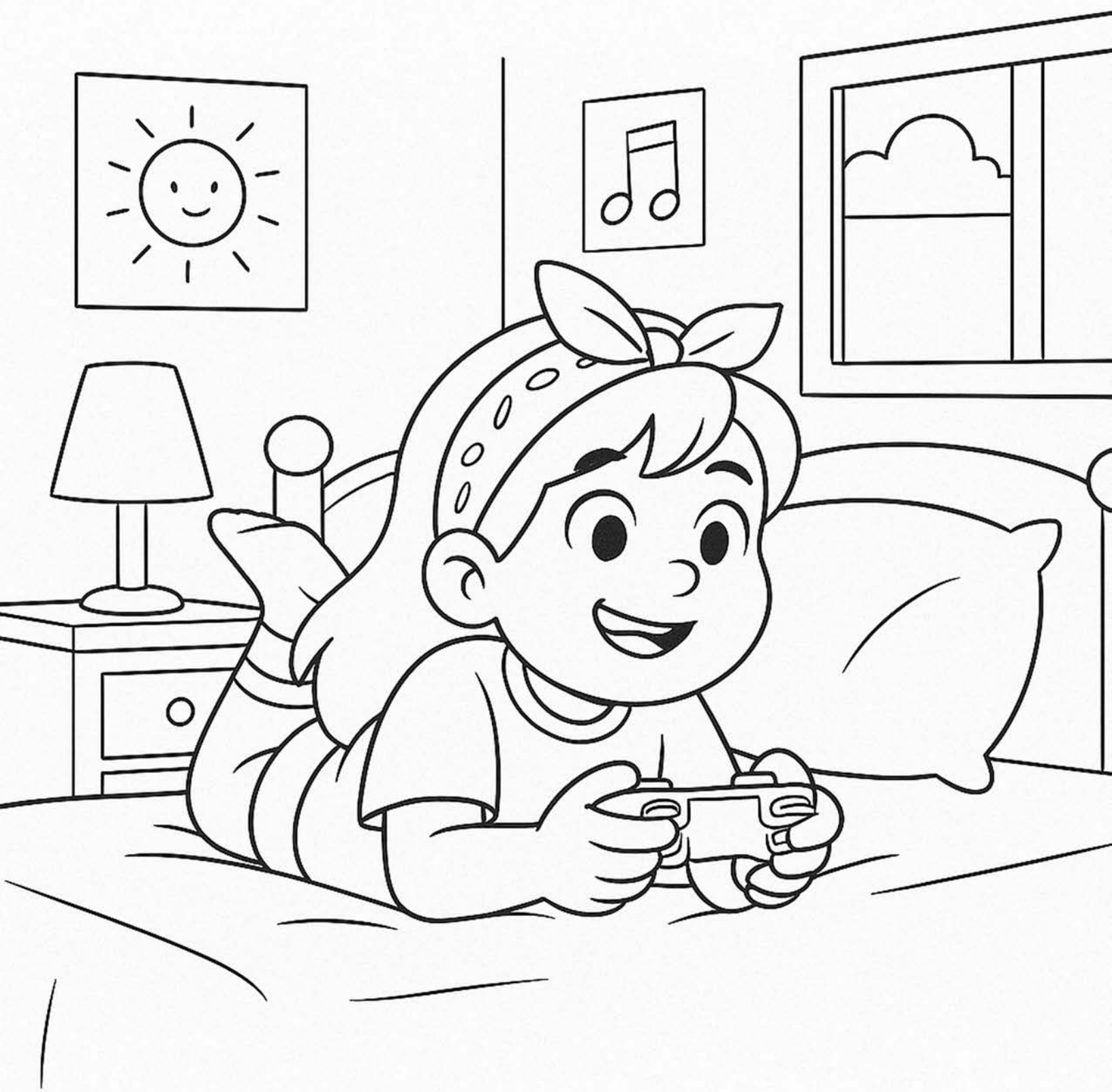
# THE GREEN BANDANA

Once upon a time, in a city full of music and sunshine, there lived a curious little girl named Luna who wore a bright green bandana that sparkled when the light hit just right.





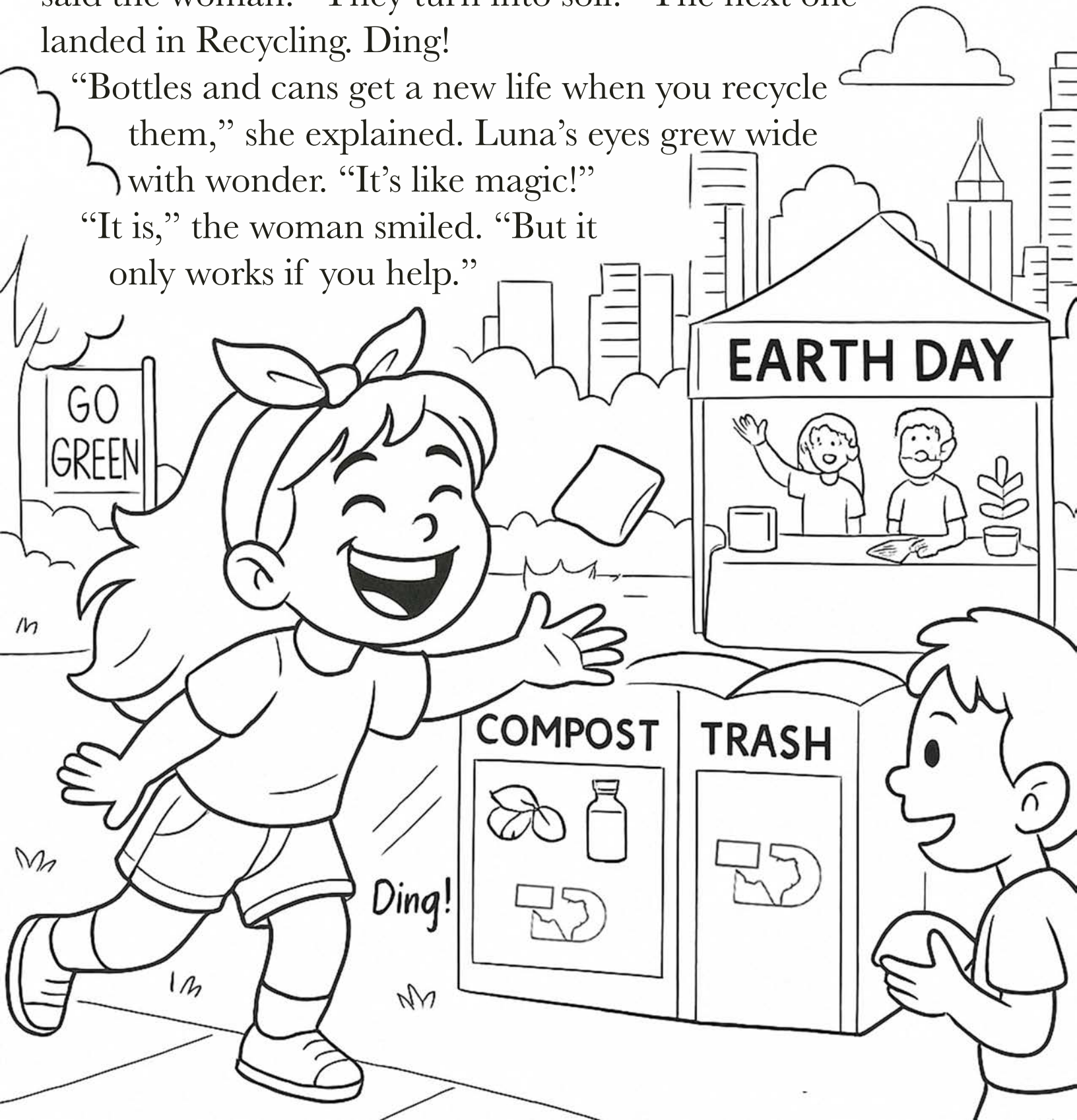
